

EQUINE SCIENCE BOOK - IT IS FINALLY HERE!!

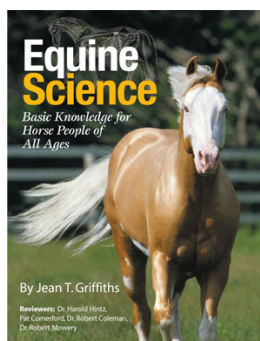
